Established in 2022, the Micah 6:8 Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior who embraces the spirit of the Micah 6:8 text:

He has told you, O mortal, what is good!

and what does the Lord

require of you

but to do justice; and to love kindness,
and to walk humbly with your God?

Qualifying recipients must be enrolled in a course of study that will lead to a "helping profession". A profession that nurtures the growth of or addresses the problems of a person's physical, psychological, intellectual, emotional, or spiritual well-being. These professions include (but are not limited to) medicine, nursing, psychotherapy, psychological counseling, social work, education, life coaching and ministry.

The recipient of the Micah 6:8 Scholarship will be a graduating senior from an area high school. Preference will be given to a UCCT member or a child of a UCCT member or a student from a marginalized population.

The successful recipient shall:

- have a desire to pursue a course of study that leads to a career in a helping profession, with a demonstrated willingness to give back to their community and help others
- plan to attend and maintain full-time enrollment in a two or four-year college/university.
